
How Do You Grow In Wisdom?



Whoever is slow to anger has great understanding, but he who has a hasty temper exalts folly.



Proverbs teaches us that part of becoming wise is learning to spot foolishness when we see it, especially when it's in us. Proverbs helps us see and name which forms of foolishness exist in us that we might turn from foolishness, receive grace and pursue wisdom.

PROVERBS 1:22

How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple? How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge?

PROVERBS 6:9

How long will you lie there, O sluggard? When will you arise from your sleep?

The Stubborn

The Stubborn fool is the most referenced fool in the book of Proverbs, named 60+ times. It is the most common type of fool, and it is likely that all of us exhibit stubborn foolishness in one way or another. They are wise in their own eyes. They have a misplaced confidence in their own thoughts, opinions and overall outlook on life, making them stubbornly committed to their way of living.

<p>The Stubborn take no pleasure in understanding because they are already convinced they understand. They take pleasure in expressing their opinion because they believe it's always right and everyone always needs to hear it.</p>	<p>The Stubborn speak truth in ways that hurt people. Truth is often hard to hear, but the Stubborn is not careful with the way they speak truth. They never care to ask how something should be said or if they are the one who should say it.</p>
<p>PROVERBS 18:2 A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion.</p>	<p>PROVERBS 26:9 Like a thorn that goes up into the hand of a drunkard is a proverb in the mouth of fools.</p>
<p>QUESTION TO CONSIDER In what ways are you quick to speak and slow to listen?</p>	<p>QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER Do you speak truth to others in order to build them up or simply prove a point? Are your words filled with both truth and grace?</p>

EASY TO OFFEND	QUICK TO QUARREL AND SLOW TO PURSUE PEACE
<p>Offense lies just beneath the surface in the life of the Stubborn. They are easily provoked, irritated and bothered by the actions of others, even if those actions are not sinful. The wise can exercise self control when offended. The Stubborn gives full expression to their offense.</p>	<p>The Stubborn enjoys a fight. They are always right in their own eyes, so being right is always their highest goal. Conflict follows them wherever they go.</p>
<p>PROVERBS 12:16</p> <p>The vexation of a fool is known at once, but the prudent ignores an insult.</p> <p>PROVERBS 29:11</p> <p>A fool gives full vent to his spirit, but a wise man quietly holds it back.</p>	<p>PROVERBS 20:3</p> <p>It is an honor for a man to keep aloof from strife, but every fool will be quarreling.</p> <p>PROVERBS 27:3</p> <p>A stone is heavy, and sand is weighty, but a fool's provocation is heavier than both.</p> <p>PROVERBS 29:9</p> <p>If a wise man has an argument with a fool, the fool only rages and laughs, and there is no quiet.</p>

How Does The Stubborn Respond To Wisdom?

They ignore it.

The Stubborn believe they are fine as they are. They are wise in their own eyes, therefore all wisdom sounds like something they don't need or they already possess.

PROVERBS 17:10

A rebuke goes deeper into a man of understanding than a hundred blows into a fool.

S. The Simple

A guiding motivation of the Simple fool is to avoid discomfort. This infiltrates how they view relationships (with God or others), deal with conflict, or handle hard and painful situations. The Simple want to keep things surface level. The common traits of the Simple fool are: no depth to belief, no long obedience in the same direction, and a shallow appetite.

<p>Depth to belief requires asking hard questions of oneself and receiving hard answers at times. It requires work, sacrifice and humility, and this is work the Simple fool does not want to take part in.</p>	<p>The Simple cannot handle suffering well — whether it is their own or the suffering of others. If an easier path presents itself, the Simple will choose that path.</p>
<p>PROVERBS 14:15 The simple believes everything, but the prudent gives thought to his steps.</p>	<p>PROVERBS 1:32 For the simple are killed by their turning away, and the complacency of fools destroys them.</p>
<p>QUESTION TO CONSIDER What does depth of belief look like in someone’s life?</p>	<p>QUESTION TO CONSIDER Is your life more marked by changing beliefs or beliefs that have changed you?</p>

SHALLOW APPETITES

The Simple gravitates toward ease and is easily satisfied by things that are cheap and fleeting.

PROVERBS 9:16–17

“Whoever is simple, let him turn in here!” And to him who lacks sense she says, “Stolen water is sweet, and bread eaten in secret is pleasant.”

QUESTION TO CONSIDER

Are your desires growing toward things of depth or things that are fleeting?

How Does The Simple Respond To Wisdom?

They avoid it.

The Simple gravitate toward voices that affirm them and never challenge them. They will distance themselves from people who offer wisdom or correction. Because there's no depth to belief, they only have space to hear what sounds good and comfortable.

PROVERBS 22:3

The prudent sees danger and hides himself, but the simple go on and suffer for it.

The Sluggard

The Sluggard's soul may crave wisdom, but it is caught by competing desires. They are not necessarily lazy, but they are committed to things of little significance. They go with their gut, but their gut often leads them astray, and their desire for wisdom doesn't outweigh their desire for their current way of life. They are unwilling to make the effort required to change.

People do not drift toward Holiness. Apart from grace-driven effort, people do not gravitate toward godliness, prayer, obedience to Scripture, faith and delight in the Lord. We drift toward compromise and call it tolerance; we drift toward disobedience and call it freedom; we drift toward superstition and call it faith. We cherish the indiscipline of lost self-control and call it relaxation; we slouch toward prayerlessness and delude ourselves into thinking we have escaped legalism; we slide toward godlessness and convince ourselves we have been liberated.

The Sluggard excuses themselves from doing what's best by convincing themselves they are still doing what's good. In doing so, they stay foolish.

The Scoffer

The Scoffer is the most devastating form of foolishness. Scoffer is the name Proverbs gives to the person whose pride is so destructive that they inflict pain on all around them.

<p>The Scoffer abuses people. Out of their pride, they try to control others and inflict pain on anyone close to them.</p>	<p>The Scoffer does not like to be corrected. They will gravitate to positions of leadership so they don't have to be under any authority. They punish those who try and keep them accountable.</p>
<p>PROVERBS 22:10</p> <p>Drive out a scoffer, and strife will go out, and quarreling and abuse will cease.</p> <p>PROVERBS 9:7</p> <p>Whoever corrects a scoffer gets himself abuse, and he who reproves a wicked man incurs injury.</p>	<p>PROVERBS 15:12</p> <p>A scoffer does not like to be reprove; he will not go to the wise.</p> <p>PROVERBS 9:8</p> <p>Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you; reprove a wise man, and he will love you.</p>

Do you seek out godly authority for instruction and help?</p>

How Does The Scoffer Respond To Wisdom?

They hate it.

They mock and abuse those who speak wisdom to them. A Scoffer cannot be reasoned with because no voice has authority in their life except their own.

PROVERBS 9:7-8

Whoever corrects a Scoffer gets himself abuse, and he who reproves a wicked man incurs injury. Do not reprove a Scoffer, or he will hate you; reprove a wise man, and he will love you.

PROVERBS 22:10

Drive out a Scoffer, and strife will go out, and quarreling and abuse will cease.


